Update from Mr Richard Clarke HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this edition of The Roselander finds you well.

I want to start by thanking everyone who engaged in our recent parental feedback survey, where we asked the Ofsted question, would you recommend The Roseland Academy to another parent? The final response rate was over 90% agree or strongly agree which I take as a positive endorsement of our vision and provision for our students. The survey also suggested a number of next steps for us which have been useful for our ongoing school improvement. We will be asking a different question each half term and we really value your feedback as there is always more we can do.

Since our last edition we have also had the examination results league tables published. I am pleased to report that we are again listed in the top of the county list with the overall rating for the results obtained by the year group as 'above average'. Within the dataset there are some outstanding performances with subjects such as English and Languages being some of the highest in the South West.

We continue our push with attendance and this will be a theme throughout the year as attending school regularly is the biggest single influence on academic success. I am very pleased to report that the latest government figures for attendance also place Roseland students in the top of the league tables for Cornish schools, which is a fantastic achievement and combined effort from both home and school. The students will report that this term we have been focussing on learning routines across the school. Research proves that the certainty and stability of routines in school is a major factor in supporting all students to focus and achieve their best in their lessons. We have developed standard Roseland approaches to starting and ending lessons, as well as routines such as questioning, feedback and a real favorite, 'silence is golden', where students practice working with sustained effort and deep focus on a piece of work.

The winter months are now upon us and this means we have to close access to all our grass areas due to muddy conditions. I am pleased that we are now able to keep the astro-turf open throughout the winter for football and this is rotated across the year groups through the week. We have moved to winter uniform which means students should have a jumper with them each day and we recommend bringing a coat. Football remains very popular at break times so we recommend a pair of trainers to change into at break to stop school shoes getting wet or damaged.

In this edition, I am pleased to share with you a taste of the many exciting extracurricular events that are taking place this term. I am particularly pleased to see the return of the popular ski trip to Italy which will run in December.

GREEN CAREERS WEEK

Following an initiative launched last year, in November we have again participated in Green Careers Week. The aim is to shed a spotlight on the varied careers that support, preserve and restore the environment.

Assemblies throughout the week focused on the availability of Green Careers within different sectors with different green goals. Within tutor time, students carried out a sustainability quiz which challenged their knowledge of environmental issues and the term Net Zero. Students also learnt more about green apprenticeships and how to access them. Year 10 also had a careers focused drop down day, where students had time to gain an understanding of degree and higher level apprenticeships, debunk myths about university and explore their level 3 (post-16) options. YEAR 9 WRITING ENRICHMENT DAY

Mr Matt Dickinson, an accomplished Everest summiteer and author, visited The Roseland Academy on Wednesday 1 November. Our Year 9 students were treated to a captivating visual journey through Everest, Antarctica, Africa, Central Asia and the Arctic, as Mr Dickinson brought his intrepid adventures to life with stunning images.

The session not only showcased breathtaking landscapes but also delved into the profound impact these experiences have had on Mr. Dickinson's passion for writing. Students were enthralled by thrilling excerpts from his works, including The Everest Files trilogy, the Mortal Chaos series, and Lie, Kill, Walk Away. Mr Dickinson also spoke about remarkable female explorers in his documentaries. Following the presentation, students had the opportunity to engage in a Q&A session, allowing them to glean insights directly from the adventurer-author.

Mr Dickinson's workshop went beyond awe-inspiring adventures, delving into the ethical, cultural and environmental dilemmas surrounding Everest. Using newspaper headlines as a starting point, students engaged in thought-provoking debates on issues such as whether Everest should be closed to climbers, the appropriateness of an eleven-year-old attempting the ascent, the role of local Sherpas risking their lives to assist Westerners, and the environmental impact of discarded rubbish.
