SUMMER EXAMINATIONS

At the start of this Summer Term, students in Year 11 sat their GCSE examinations. Students were given lots of revision opportunities throughout the academic year, and from the start of this term, were also offered the option to come into school early to attend revision sessions from 7.45am with their classroom teaching staff ahead of the exam which would take place that day.

The Roseland Academy also provided drop-down sessions, which means a whole morning or afternoon session of revision for certain subjects. These sessions allowed full concentration and intense revision with the subject department staff, giving students the opportunity to review earlier content covered, ask questions and practice more exam questions prior to the official exam.

The final GCSE exam took place on Thursday 23 June, making this our Year 11 students' last day at The Roseland Academy. We marked the occasion with the traditional shirt and leavers year book signing, group photographs and a Leavers' Assembly where a number of awards honouring students for achievements across a variety of areas were presented along with some heartfelt speeches and music from the school bands.

Students were commended for their hard work throughout their time at The Roseland and reflected on their time here with photos on display going all of the way back to their first year.

Mrs Atkins-Gammons, Learning Leader for Year 11, prepared a video which included farewell messages from proud staff. Well done Year 11, we look forward to seeing your hard-earned results in August.




LEAVERS' BALL




We were delighted to raise a total of £840.74 for this deserving cause.




CREATIVE ARTS WITH FALMOUTH UNIVERSITY

On Wednesday 18 May, The Roseland Academy hosted an inspirational day of Creative Careers advice. This day was led by Falmouth University Outreach Officer, Ms Sian Court and two Student Ambassadors from the University. GCSE Art, Drama, Music and Photography students in Year 10 took part in a series of interactive talks throughout the day as part of their timetabled lessons, as well as a group of creative Year 9 students who were also selected to join in.

The aim of this session was to showcase the important part that the creative sector plays in the UK economy, with an ever growing number and diversity of jobs requiring creative thinking and design skills. Students participated in practical exercises to discover the wide range of creative job roles available in the workplace, from architecture, photography, robotics and fashion design to film, television, social media and gaming opportunities. They also learned that within each pathway lies an even wider variety of possible job roles - for example, within a photo shoot there could be roles for stylists, props assistants and lighting engineers, as well as the photographer. There are an equally incredible amount of 'behind the scenes' roles within film and television in addition to the actors themselves. There was also some time to quiz the ambassadors about university life.


We hope these talks have inspired students to explore some new creative pathways and build on their existing skills.

Collagraphy is a creative printmaking process involving the creation of textured printing plates, using a variety of materials, which are then inked up before pressing.

On Tuesday 21 June, we welcomed our Year 7 September starters to an induction and welcome day at The Roseland Academy. Students from our nine feeder primary schools got onto the school bus for the first time and for some it may have even been their first time visiting The Roseland!

The Year 6 students seemed to settle in quickly following an assembly in the Hall and being told which tutor group they will be in. They were then given information about what to expect come September when they start at The Roseland. They each had sessions with their tutor and tutor groups to make new friends and learn some Roseland routines.

The Junior Choir is always popular amongst The Roseland students. It is made up of students from Years 7 and 8 and they practice one period every week. This term we held auditions for students who wished to get involved. All abilities were encouraged to attend the auditions and over 40 students took part. They enjoyed singing some fun 'warm ups' as a whole choir before auditioning in smaller groups of three or four.

UNIVERSAL MUSIC UK SOUND FOUNDATION

In May, we were fortunate to have two full days with music specialist Matt Douglas, funded by our generous sponsor Universal Music UK Sound Foundation.

The workshops are part of a wider programme of musical activities for Key Stage 3 designed to promote positive engagement with practical music making, with an emphasis on ensemble skills, creativity, collaboration and developing greater confidence in students own musical potential. Year 8 students participated in the first session and enjoyed a range of musical activities including singing some mash-ups of popular songs around the piano, before moving on to play ukuleles, keyboards, drums and guitars, working collaboratively in small groups.

Year 7 students enjoyed a similar session, playing ukuleles, guitars, keyboards, percussion and orchestral instruments. This term has been extremely busy with different sports fixtures taking place leading up to the School Games Final.


